Dear Sir:

We, the Selectmen of the Town of Freedom, petition your Monorable Commissioners, to have the road leading from O. B. Ward residence in a North Mar.Apr. & Dec. East direction to the old Davis place, s9-called, a distance of approximately

one half mile (%).

There are no houses between the two places. It is unecessary to keep said road broke out and open for travel during the months of December, January, Pebruary, March and April, or any part of such months, and praying said Commissioners, after notice and hearing on such petition, to decide whether such road shall be kept open or closed during such period or part thereof. and for how many years not to exceed ten, such closing order, if made, as prayed for, shall be operative.





in reply to your letter. I will try to answer your questions, concerning the status of this road.

juestion 1: This road was discontinued from Ollie's residence East to junction of road leading to under Beaver Hill Road, which is just down over the hill from the last house on the road. The rest of the road that continues East by your property could be considered an abandoned road. I believe you would have a right to control this road by a gate and permission only signs. Snowmobilers enjoy this route over the hill.

ruestion 2: The procedure for towns to accept a road for maintenance is; Road must be at least eighteen feet wide, including shoulders, eighteen inches of gravel upon a solid sub. base. also culverts and ditchesto make proper drainage. This would have to be okayed by the Selectmen and Planning Board. Then it would be inserted in an article at Town Meeting, to accept or reject.

by thoughts at this time: All towns are in an economy crunch, and I seel that voters would refrain from accepting any new liability at this lime. However, I feel that maybe in the future, as more people build, in these abandoned and closed roads, the County Commissioners will demand the towns to reopen these roads to the public.

Re: Beaver Ridge Road

Dear Ms. Brugger:

Your letter of September 3rd asks about the legal status of Beaver Ridge Road. You said that that portion from the Oilie Ward property to the upper end was discontinued by vote of the 1956 annual town meeting. This would have resulted in a reversion of all public interest in the road to the respective abutting property owners to the center of the way unless otherwise stoted in the order of discontinuance (see R.S. ch. 96, § 32 (1954)). (The 1956 town meeting records should be checked to make sure that this is not the case.) If the order of discontinuance did not "ate otherwise, this portion of Beaver Ridge Road would indeed be private property and subject to posting by its owner(s). Whether one abutter may crect a "Private Road" sign on another's land, however, is a private civil matter to be resolved between the parties and is of no legitimate interest to the Town. Accordingly, I would decline to advise the parties on this particular issue.

Incidentally, 30 years of non-maintenance ("abandonment") constitutes an alternative to formal discontinuance and would have no effect on an already discontinued way (see 23 M.R.S.A. § 3028).

I hope this answers your question. Please let us know if we can be of further assistance.

Dear Mrs. Seel:

The Town of Freedom and the residents of that portion of Ollie Ward Road (now known as Beaver Ridge Road due to the 911 designation, hereinafter referred to as "Beaver Ridge Road") after Ollie Ward place would like to submit the following question for your review and determination:

"Given the facts below, who owns Beaver Ridge Road after Ollie Ward's place?"

These are the facts as agreed upon by the Town of Freedom and the residents of Beaver Ridge Road after Ollie Ward's place:

- Until March 3, 1956, the Town of Freedom maintained the entire length of Beaver Ridge Road.
- On March 3, 1956, the Town of Freedom voted to discontinue Beaver Ridge Road from Ollie Ward's place.
- Since March 3, 1956, the Town of Freedom has had no involvement with Beaver Ridge Road after Ollie Ward's place.
- According to Statute 23 MRSA Section 3029;

It shall be prima facie evidence that a Town or County way established prior to January 1, 1946 and not kept passable for the use of motor vehicles at the expense of the municipality or county for a period of 30 or more consecutive years next prior to January 1, 1976, has been discontinued by abandonment.

Beaver Ridge Road was established prior to January 1, 1946.

 The Town of Freedom acknowledges that they have not kept the section of Beaver Ridge Road past Ollie Ward's place passable for 30 or more years, beginning March 3, 1956.

As more than 30 years have passed since March 3, 1956, the section of Beaver Ridge Road after Ollie Ward's place is now arguably abandoned.

According to Statute 23 MRSA Section 3026:

... If any town way was discontinued under the pre-1965 version of section 3004, no public easement would remain unless the vote approved by the legislative body expressly retained an easement. Caselaw dictated that ownership of the land reverted to the abutters to the centerline, in the absence of the showing of a greater interest. [Caselaw omitted from quote]

There was no vote by the legislative body retaining an easement, nor was there a showing of
greater interest.

Therefore, pursuant to statutes and the caselaw, the ownership of the land arguably reverted to the landowners on either side of the centerline, as of March 3, 1986.

We appreciate your time on our behalf and look forward to your response.
